

## 2018 Reading Guide

Advent, from the Latin word for "coming," is a season of preparation and expectation for the celebration of Jesus' birth and for the final coming of Christ. Christians around the world observe Advent beginning four Sundays before Christmas. This year Advent begins on December 2 and concludes December 24.

As you prepare your home and heart for the coming of Christ, we encourage you to participate in the spiritual practice of reading Holy Scripture daily. In this *Reading Guide* we have provided a daily reading plan to help you read the entire Gospel of Luke during the 23 days of Advent. All you need is a Bible, Bible App, or computer to access the readings (we recommend the NRSV Bible). After each daily reading is a "Spiritual Practice" to help you explore, grow, and deepen your faith and your Advent experience.

The Gospel of Luke presents Jesus as a humanitarian and a friend to the outcasts. This gospel sets out an orderly account of the words and works of Jesus as the divine-human Savior. Luke's gospel is geared toward educating Gentile readers, so be on the lookout for Old Testament references. This Gospel is the only one that tells the traditional Christmas story of Mary and Joseph traveling to Bethlehem and staying in a stable where the Christ Child is born. More importantly, Luke's Gospel shows the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus as the fulfillment of the Jewish scriptures.

□ Sunday	Dec. 2	Journey	Do something today to help you prepare for adventure.
$\square$ Monday	Dec. 3	Watch	Watch out for the forces of darkness. Be the light.
$\square$ Tuesday	Dec. 4	Focus	Pay attention to the hidden and obscure. Be patient.
$\square$ Wednesday	Dec. 5	Night	Move out of darkness into light.
☐ Thursday	Dec. 6	Light	How do you share the light of Christ with others?
$\square$ Friday	Dec. 7	Sprout	Trust that in spite of appearances, new growth is coming.
☐ Saturday	Dec. 8	Alert	Stay steady in prayer.
□ Sunday	Dec. 9	Wild	How is God guiding you in your wilderness?
□ Monday	Dec. 10	$\mathbf{Cry}$	Know that your cries are heard by God.
☐ Tuesday	Dec. 11	Grow	Continue to grow.
