ONLINE WORSHIP

Sundays, 8:45 AM

Every Sunday we broadcast a worship service at 8:45 AM which can be viewed in several ways:

This 45-minute worship experience brings together familiar liturgy and music, along with some innovative offerings made possible by the online format. We hope you will join us often.

OUTDOOR WORSHIP Sundays, 8:45 AM, 11:15 AM, & 5:00 PM

We have recently begun offering outdoor in-person worship in the Church circle and on the lawn. Each Sunday (weather permitting) we offer five 30-minute Eucharist (bread only) services, including a Discovery service for children and families.

All services require registration, with a 20-person limited capacity per service. Registration opens on Tuesdays at 11:15 AM and closes on Thursdays at 12 Noon for services the following Sunday. If you are unable to access the online registration, you may call 704-333-0378 to request a spot.

At registration, participants agree to a self-check health screening at home. When on campus, appropriate social distancing and mask wearing will be required, including during the service. Participants should bring their own chairs or blankets, masks, and hand sanitizer. Bulletins are emailed to registered participants and can be printed at home or accessed via mobile device during the service. The Book of Common Prayer and Bible readings are also accessible online, or may be brought from home. Please wear your Christ Church name tag if you have one.

PRAYER AT CHRIST CHURCH

In these stay-at-home times, it can be hard to find "a deserted place" to pray. The good news is that the grounds of Christ Church provide several options for private, personal prayer. If you need a set-apart place to center your heart and spend time with God, we invite you to one of the following spots* on the grounds of your spiritual home:

The Chapel Garden | Directly outside the back window of the Chapel under the Bell Tower.

The Ginkgo Tree | Outside the Nave between the circle and Providence Road.

The Memorial Garden | Full of peaceful spots with benches between the Nave and All Saints' Hall.

The Middle Garden | Surrounded by crepe myrtles, this spot is tucked away in the midst of the lower and middle parking lots.

The Pet Memorial Garden | Next to the upper parking lot, this garden offers a more removed location for prayer.

Christ Church Vestry Elections

In a typical year, at our Annual Parish Meeting in December, the people of Christ Church elect five persons to serve on the Vestry for a three-year term. However, this is not a typical year, and due to COVID-19, we will not hold an Annual Parish Meeting. Therefore, for this year and with our Bishop's approval, we have amended our Vestry election process.

The Election Process

As in the past, the Rector and the Senior Warden, in consultation with the Vestry, have appointed a Nominating Committee to identify qualified nominees for a three-year Vestry term beginning in January 2021. This year's committee is Jane Coulter, Doug Ey, Hooper Hardison (Chair), Sally Mitchener, Arrington Mixon, Jane Showalter (ex-officio), and Ken Thompson. Prior to the Vestry's November 16th meeting, the Nominating Committee will deliver to the Rector and the Vestry five nominees to fill the positions currently held by Nikki DeVillers, Alex Kelly, David Kern, Sally Mitchener and Jane Showalter. Other nominations may be made in writing to the Rector no later than twelve (12) days before the Vestry's December 2020 meeting. Vestry nominations will be deemed closed at the close of business on the twelfth day prior to the Vestry's December meeting. The Vestry will then review and vote on the nominees at its December meeting. Unfortunately, we are not able to hold a parish-wide election this year. The new Vestry members will serve with the following members: Louise Bonner, Jane Coulter, Doug Ey, Susan Hamilton, Julie Marr, Randall Mountcastle, Geoff Peters, Ken Thompson, Chris Ullrich, and Betsy Zarzour.

Who Can Serve

Service on the Vestry is an important ministry in our parish. The Vestry is responsible for the executive and organizational affairs of Christ Church and provides lay leadership in the spiritual life of the parish.

The Vestry has charged the Nominating Committee with recommending a diverse slate of nominees. Nominees should have an understanding of the various needs of our parishioners and our community, knowledge of the governance and traditions of the Episcopal Church, and experience in areas such as board service, financial management, and personnel management. All nominees must be confirmed Episcopalians and communicants in good standing. Under Diocesan Canons and our Bylaws, "good standing" means that for the past year the nominee "has been faithful in corporate worship (unless for good cause prevented) and has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God." Nominees must not have served on the Vestry during the preceding two years. In addition, it is customary for the committee to include on its slate at least two parishioners who have not previously served a full term on the Vestry.
