Confirmation 2020

When the pandemic hit and our state issued stay-at-home orders, Confirmation was one of many events that had to be put on hold – a huge disappointment to our 8th grade students and their families. Our youth ministry team brainstormed ways to bring families together for this special rite of passage.

Once it was safe to meet in small groups outside, we sent a request to our Bishops to hold six services over two Saturdays. This allowed us to meet Diocesan safety requirements while also ensuring that all 68 eighth graders and all adults awaiting confirmation could be blessed and confirmed by our bishops. You can imagine our delight when the Bishops said yes! On November 7 and 14, we held six separate confirmation services with families in the sunshine-lit circle, in front of the steps of the Nave.

Here's a Confirmation reflection from April and Jay Harrill and their daughter Addison:

Our hearts were full as Addison was confirmed during one of several outside services in November at Christ Church. The confirmation service was a very special and a joyful reminder of God's everlasting love. This important step for youth is just the beginning of the spiritual walk they will make in life.

Following months of disappointments and missed occasions for our young people, this was a blessing to say the least. Families, in groups of four, were spaced out on the circle and one by one, confirmands went forward to be confirmed after hearing a homily about the parable of talents from the Book of Matthew. Each received an intentional and personal prayer led by the bishop. Experienced outside on a beautiful fall day, it was a heartfelt service for which many families are grateful.

Many things have changed over the course of this past year. We continue to learn a lot and gain a greater appreciation for things in our lives. Doing things differently can create a positive shift in many aspects. Maybe new approaches to events or something such as confirmation will be gifts we glean from, having to consider non-traditional ways of doing things.

Thank you to the clergy and leaders that made it possible to hold sacred and safe services. Your care with each service, all while staying within guidelines to maintain health and safety, was a testament to the Church that helps families instill a rich and full sense of Christian identity in our children, and equips them to strive to be the Church of the world.




