Eric Liu



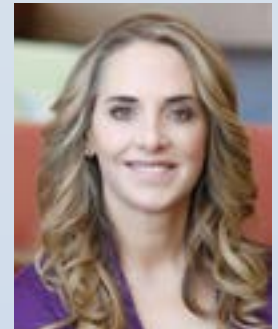
