As you can tell from this study guide, stewardship at Christ Church will play an integral part in celebrating generosity this year. We hope the growing ministry and education around generosity will make stewardship at our parish feel deeper and more meaningful, as we focus on God's calling for us to be generous in every part of our lives. Leading up to **Celebration Sunday**, **October 29**, we ask every parishioner to take time to pray about their commitment to God, and to Christ Church in 2018, and to be generous with the gifts God has entrusted to each of us. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life. - 1 Timothy 6: 18-19 The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. - 2 Corinthians 9:6-8

Let's start a conversation about generosity.

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." - Matthew 6:21

Jesus said it best ... our money and our love go together. Does this mean we need only look at our bank statement to see what we live for? Does your checkbook reflect your beliefs? Think of ten big purchases that you have made in the past year. Now mentally label them "provided by and belonging to God." How does this change your approach to using God's gifts?

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand." -1 Chronicles 29:14

Our talents, our upbringing, our education ... it all comes from God. He loves us and gives us what we need to spread his grace even further. What else have you received from God? How is your life different because of His gifts? Can you think back to a challenging time and thank God for the gift of clarity that came from the situation? "Keep your lives from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." – Hebrews 13:5

Every day, we see hundreds, if not thousands, of advertisements, each trying to convince us that what we have is not enough. We need something new, better, faster. Desire becomes hope, which leads to wants, and wants become needs. Pay attention to and identify five ads today ... what type of salvation do they offer (security, prestige, comfort)? Do any of them sell hope, grace or forgiveness?

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes?" – Matthew 6:25

Jesus said that worrying about money and the future indicated a lack of trust in God. What do you worry about in your life? How can you learn to share what you have today without worrying about needing more tomorrow? Do you proceed through life knowing God has your back? Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver 2 Corinthians 9:7

Generosity means living for God and others, not only for ourselves. Stewardship is just one aspect of a lifestyle of generosity. But it is an important part for our parish as we answer the call to do God's work in the world. Intentional giving requires discernment. Use this helpful chart in your decision-making process. Visionary (tithe and beyond)

I give 10% or more of my income to Christ Church as an important part of living into my spiritual principles. Giving monetarily to the future of Christ Church's ministry and mission is a vital part of my calling as a Christian.
