

Hope Teams Empower Families

A Hope Team generally consists of 3-6 volunteers who partner with a family to provide love, support, and encouragement as the family moves from homelessness toward permanent housing and self-sufficiency. The Hope Team builds relationships with the family members under the guidance of the CFH Social Worker and Hope Team Manager.

Hope Teams Provide Support By:

- * Tutoring a child in the family
- * Celebrating birthdays, holidays, and graduations
- * Assisting with budgeting goals
- * Having a picnic in the park
- * Helping prepare for parent/teacher conferences
- * Supporting the parent in educational and career goals

A Different Kind of Volunteering:

- Serving on a Hope Team requires a one year commitment to walk beside one
 of our families every step of the way as they complete the Charlotte Family
 Housing program
- Hope Teams must attend Working Together. A 2 part, 4 hour training focusing on the impact of poverty on families.
- Hope Teams are one of the most beneficial volunteer opportunities at Charlotte Family Housing for our families experiencing homelessness.
