# Habitat for Humanity - Our 28th Home

#### Why do I believe in the mission of Habitat for Humanity?

Habitat is a Christian organization that, in their words, "seeks to put God's words into action," and welcomes all faiths. Christ Church was one of the founding Churches of our local Habitat affiliate in 1983 and we have remained active and involved ever since.

Over those 33 years, the organization has provided more than 1,500 families with affordable housing. Collectively, those homeowners have invested \$14 million back into the community in the form of property taxes paid. On past builds, police officers have stopped by the construction site to thank us for building the home, because a neighborhood of homeowners has a lower crime rate than a neighborhood of renters.

Today's Habitat houses are energy-efficient and LEED Certified. Habitat also recycles construction waste. There are two Habitat Restores in Charlotte that not only encourage people to recycle furniture and building products, but also produce income to fund Habitat's mission.

More than 92% of the money Habitat raises goes to lowincome housing. Habitat tithes money raised here to build houses in third world countries, primarily El Salvador. To date, more than \$3 million has gone toward this effort.

The Habitat program is unquestionably a hand-up, rather than hand-out, program. Each homeowner is required to complete 300 hours of "sweat equity" on others' homes, as well as their own, before they can purchase their home with a mortgage funded by Habitat. Habitat also requires its homeowners to complete classes in budget management to help owners keep their homes, resulting in a low default rate. The Habitat program is designed not only to assist people in buying homes, but to ensure they keep them.

#### Why do I keep volunteering for Habitat year after year?

I believe the old saying, "God has no hands than our hands," and I also believe the words of Jesus, "in as much as you have done it unto the least of these my children, you have done it unto me." I believe we are called to serve others.

When we work together in an effort such as Habitat for Humanity, we are not focused solely on building a house, but rather a community. Some of us have been building these houses for more than twenty years and continue to come back year after year. Outreach projects such as these are so enjoyable and satisfying that we forget we are also doing good for someone we did not previously know. It is a great way to get to know other members of Christ Church and develop lasting friendships. It is also a great way to get to know the homeowner.

Not only are you building relationships, you're also learning construction skills you can use on your own home. No prior experience is needed; this is true "on-the-job" training. These projects have a definite start and stop time, as opposed to projects that seem to go on forever.

The first three days of a build are my favorite, because they remind me of things we buy with those words "some assembly required" on the box. We start with slab on Thursday, and by Saturday afternoon we have a roof, windows, and doors installed. We typically have different tasks every week, which prevents boredom or monotony.

By the time we get to the dedication, I am always amazed that a group of dedicated volunteers, many of whom had no prior building experience but simply a willingness to help others, have built a beautiful home.

**Did you know?** Christ Church has given more than \$1,250,172 since 1991 to further Habitat's mission.

# A Peek Inside Godly Play

Have you wondered what the words "Godly Play" mean? Perhaps a kind of recess or nursery for our youngest church-goers? Essentially, Godly Play is a program for children ages three and up to develop a deeper understanding of what takes place during a church service by modeling the traditions, symbols, stories, and rituals used in Episcopal worship.

Young children have an innate sense of wonder. Godly Play encourages wonder and curiosity by allowing children to explore expressions of faith through story, play, and hands-on experiences that mirror the worship



practices used in Church. Each Sunday a trained Godly Play storyteller uses symbols and wooden figures to share stories from both the Old and New Testaments. Young participants are encouraged to wonder aloud about how stories from the Bible relate to them. Each week, children also share a "feast" of cookies and water to represent the practice of Eucharist. There are opportunities for children to practice setting up the altar and also time for a creative response with art materials.

Godly Play is an opportunity for our youngest worshipers to spend part of their Sunday mornings constructing meaning in a developmentally appropriate way. Godly Play allows our young children to deepen their understanding of the presence of God.

We offer Godly Play every Sunday during the school year at 8:45 AM, and during the summer months at 10:30 AM.
