Christ Church: A Beautiful Place, Inside and Out

Most of the pastoral ministry at Christ Church takes place parishioner to parishioner, often through quiet gestures and small kindnesses you don't always hear about. From friendly greetings as we enter a worship service on Sundays to prayers offered on behalf of others, the people of Christ Church care for each other every day. Here are just a few examples of many beautiful moments shared:

- A bouquet made from the altar flowers by the Sunshine Guild is delivered to the door to brighten someone's day.
- A woman who lives in a nursing home with no family in town is taken out by another Christ Church member to see a movie.
- A man receives a prayer shawl while sick, and it means so much to him he asks to meet the person who knit it for him so he can thank her personally.
- A member of the choir participating in a Living with Grief and Hope course sings "There is a Balm in Gilead" a *capella* for her fellow broken-hearted in the group.
- A member who is in addiction recovery accompanies another member to his first AA meeting.
- A few folks gather each month at Church to send birthday cards to parishioners over eighty.
- A parishioner and her six-year-old visit a Church member who lives at Southminster.
- A Christ Church volunteer gives Theo the therapy dog a ride to work at HopeWay.
- A member who has lived with cancer is willing to speak to and encourage a parishioner with a recent diagnosis of the same.



There is no other form for the Christian life except a common one. Until and unless Christ is experienced as a living relationship between people, the Gospel remains largely an abstraction. Until Christ is passed on personally through faithfulness and forgiveness, through concrete bonds of union, I doubt whether he is passed on at all.

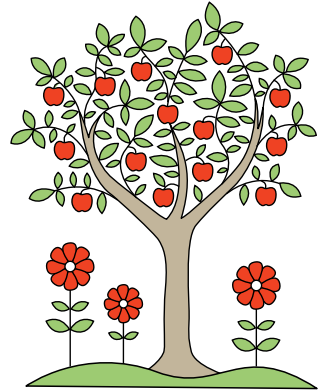
